Veterans Day Events





Staff-Parish Update

It has been brought to our attention that while we shared details about Pastor Cross at the time of his assignment and he shared additional information about himself in his first few sermons, not everyone in the congregation had been able to read his biography, so it is included it here.



John Michael Cross was born November 11, 1958 and is the fourth of five sons of George and Wanetta Cross from Woodland Illinois. He attended the Woodland Grade School and The Watseka Community High School graduating in 1977.

He worked for the Unit Nine School District as Head Custodian for five years and approximately ten years in the construction trades. In 1992 he received his call to ministry. July 1993 he started serving the Armstrong Penfield Parish UMC as a Student Licensed Local Pastor while attending Danville Area Community College.

July 1996 John started serving the Sadorus Parkville Parish UMC and transferred to the University Of Illinois, Urbana Champaign to finish his Bachelors Degree graduating in 1999. In the fall of 1999 he matriculated

to Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore Kentucky. July 2002 he started serving the Cisne Johnsonville Parish UMC. December 2003 John graduated with a Masters Of Divinity Degree from Asbury Theological Seminary.

January 2004 John started his first full time appointment, serving the Bonfield Grand Prairie Parish UMC.

In June 2004 he was commissioned as a Probationary Member of the Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church. In June 2007 John was Ordained as an Elder in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church.

July 2011 John started serving the Eldorado Raleigh Parish UMC, were he remained until joining us earlier this year.

John has been active in the Walk To Emmaus spiritual renewal movement since 1992 and currently serves as the Community Spiritual Director for the Little Egypt Walk To Emmaus.
