Are you making any New Year's Resolutions? I do not like to be pessimistic, but it has been my experience that few New Year's Resolutions ever get kept. That does not mean that they are a bad thing.

I suspect that each and every one of us has things that we should change in our lives. Maybe God, through the Holy Spirit is calling you to change. It takes a great commitment and effort to make serious changes in our lives. Luke 14:28-29 says,




The Meaning of Epiphany

Epiphany, which comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, means “an appearance” or “a revealing.” Centuries ago, the church set aside January 6, the 12th day after Christmas, to mark the revealing of Jesus as Christ to the wise men, who were Gentiles. Jesus’ first followers were Jewish, so the revelation of the divine Christ to the non-Jewish magi reminds us that Jesus came to earth to save the whole world.

Symbols of Epiphany include light, a star, a crown (or three crowns) and a globe or stylized portrayal of the world. The color of Epiphany is green to symbolize life, growth, hope and eternity.

On the church calendar, the Epiphany season lasts until Ash Wednesday, which is determined by the date of Easter.

Introducing our Faith Community Nursing Program



Judy Lafary, RN with a specialty in Parish Nursing is acting as Parish Nurse for our congregation. This is a specialty within the nursing profession and health ministry. She acts as a staff member and works in tandem with the clergy and congregation. A parish nurse promotes and practices WHOLISTIC health (body mind and spirit). She must abide by HIPPA regulations and acts as mandatory reporter for abuse or exploitation of children, seniors, the disabled and domestic abuse.

Judy will be available to anyone in the congregation and their family members. She will be available anytime by phone or email. (217)629-7559, cell (217)720-0303, judith62@gmail.com

Regular office hours will be on each Wednesday from 10 till Noon in the fellowship room next to the sanctuary of our church. At that time she can do blood pressure checks, blood sugar checks, oxygen levels checks, review medications, assist with referrals and any questions, do consults and insurance assistance.

The second Sunday of each month after the morning service, Judy will be available for any of the above services.

There will be monthly visits or follow up calls for the homebound and extended care facilities for church members, including family members as requested by church member.

There will be hospital visits as needed. Follow up visits or calls for post procedure and post hospital stays as needed.

Judy will be available as companion or transport to doctor visits. Available as health care advocate and educator.

Please keep our Health Community Nursing Program and Judy in your prayers, and feel free to ask her any questions.
